Parking Office on MCV Campus Moving to New Location

On May 1, the Parking and Transportation customer service office on the MCV Campus will move to 659 North 8th Street, located on the first floor of the Eighth Street Deck.

This new office will have the following features:

- Free 30-minute on-site parking available for parking customer service visitors in the Eighth Street Deck
- Computer terminals in the lobby so customers can access needed information without standing in line
- Handicapped accessibility into the building and counters built at wheelchair height

The MCV Campus office will also have extended hours:

Monday-Friday, 7:00 a.m. until 6:30 p.m.

Public Safety Tip



During the past two weeks, there has been an increase in car vandalism and thefts, primarily of GPS systems, on our campuses and in surrounding neighborhoods.

Here are some tips to prevent the theft of your GPS device and to reduce the risk of vandalism to your car:

Hide your GPS device

The majority of GPS thefts occur because someone knows it is available. Mounting the GPS device on your dashboard instead of the windshield helps conceal the equipment. Remove the device and lock it in your glove compartment or trunk or take it with you.

Wipe away the evidence

Rings left by the suction cups of the GPS device advertise the presence of the unit. Even if you take it with you, someone may vandalize your car in search of the device after seeing the rings left by the suction cups. Keep towelettes on hand to wipe away the rings.

Please remind your friends, family and coworkers of these important tips.

Report suspicious activity immediately to the VCU Police by calling 828-1234 or by picking up the flashing Emergency Response Telephones (ERTS) located in all VCU parking facilities.
